Program Level - Undergraduate certificate • Program Length - 38 weeks

With the resurgence of the oil and gas industry, there will be a great need for welders for pipeline collection, distribution, processing (cracking) plants, and facility construction. The average Ohio wage for welders is \$34,000/year, with highly skilled welders making over twice that amount! Hobart Welding curriculum will be used to achieve American Welding Society (AWS) certifications.

## Enrollment Requirements

Students wishing to enroll in the Welding program at the Mid-East CTC-Adult Education must complete the following enrollment procedures in order to be considered for acceptance into this class:

**Application:** Students must complete a written Application for Admissions and return it to the Adult Education Office during your interview with the Admissions Coordinator. You may set an appointment with the Admissions Coordinator by calling our office at 740-455-3111 or 1-800-832-7545.

**General Assessment:** A basic assessment measuring academic areas must be completed. This will be scheduled through the Admissions Office.

**Financial Aid:** Arrangements to have the cost of tuition, books, and supplies paid in full, must be completed to the satisfaction of the Financial Aid Coordinator. Students may apply for Federal Financial Aid in the form of a Pell Grant by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov).
